


CLEANING & BRUSHING YOUR TURF



DO

Regularly remove the organic materials by hand and rinse the artificial turf surfaces with a hose.

Use a leaf blower, rake and brush to keep your lawn looking fresh and new for a very long time.



DO

Brush your turf with a stiff broom to keep the blades standing up straight. Areas exposed to high traffic may require more brushing than others.

Brush the grass against the grain in high traffic areas. Brushing against the grain will help avoid matting.



DEEP CLEANING & STAINS

DO

For harder to remove stains, mix basic household detergent with water or use Simple Green®. Avoid using cleaners containing chlorine bleach.



DON'T

We discourage the use of bleach and other toxic or harsh products. You may void your warranty or create a toxic environment for your family and pets.

Always RINSE the lawn and dilute the treatments to help them go through the backing and deep into the base and soil materials.



Tips for Artificial Grass

PET AREAS



DO

Flush the turf areas that have been exposed to urine/waste with a hose as needed. If you notice any unpleasant odors a mixture of distilled vinegar and water or "Simple Green" can be used to neutralize them.



DON'T

When removing feces be sure to remove from the surface. Do not hose the feces into the turf.

FIRE & WEED ISSUES



DON'T

Be sure that your turf is not exposed to any extreme heat that may magnify the sunlight and burn the turf. Keep any kind of flames away from the turf (cigarettes, grills, fireworks, etc). Don't lay hot landscape tools on turf, the motor will melt the turf.



DO

Weeds can grow on top of synthetic grass. To kill them, use good old apple cider vinegar in a garden pressure sprayer. Spray so that you saturate the grass to reach the seeds that are germinating and those that are hiding in between blades. Do not over spray on your plants. Then pull out weeds you see on the surface. You don't want them decomposing down into the blades. Use a grooming rake to agitate the surface to help brush up the blades. Use a leaf blower to remove any remaining organic material. Re-apply as needed and maintain.

REFRESHING THE TURF



DO

Use a hose and spray nozzle to freshen up turf if you live in areas with scarce rain.



DON'T

Never use a power washer. A sprinkler setting is a better way to rinse, allowing the water to saturate the surfaces, and then drain through.





Who Backs the Warranty?

The Bottom Line: The Warranty is only as good as the company providing it.

In the event that Smart Turf elects to issue a credit in lieu of repair or replacement, said credit shall only apply to the affected area of the synthetic grass giving rise to the claim. The credit shall be issued to the dealer, as a percentage of the replacement cost of new synthetic grass of the same or comparable quality. The credit will be good only toward the purchase of Smart Turf artificial grass; there will be no cash payment.

Installer should have their own warranty for installation. We cover Smart Turf artificial grass products only. This warranty does not cover installation, labor, or any other accompanying costs.

Warranty Will Cover:

- *Color Integrity (excessive fading)*
- *Ultra Violet degradation (premature yarn breakage)*
- *Manufacture defect: lines in turf, defective or missing tufts.*
- *Cost of the artificial Turf*

Warranty Will NOT Cover:

- *Acts of nature (earthquakes, floods, hurricane, etc.)*
- *Improper installation*
- *Indirect or incidental damages (accidents of vandalism, abuse, negligence, cuts, burns or neglect)*
- *Damage that may occur during shipping/transportation*
- *Melting caused by low E windows or sun magnification*
- *Failure to properly maintain, protect, or repair the turf (improper cleaning methods use of harsh, caustic chemicals).*
